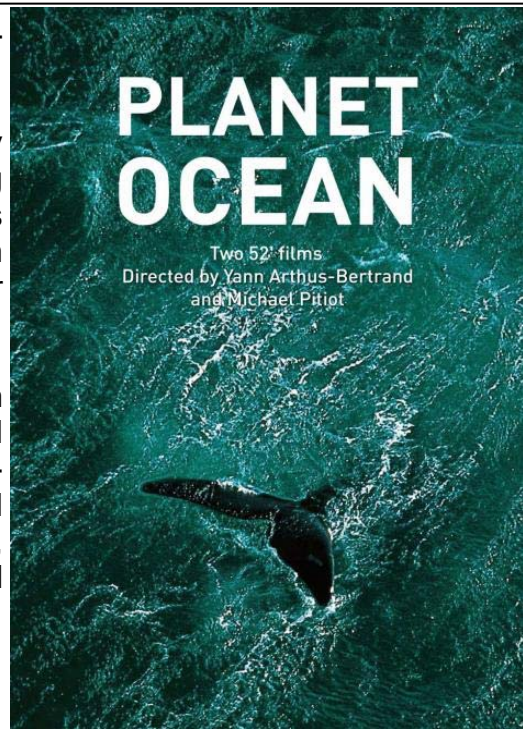
Planet Ocean
