

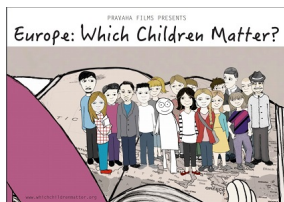
On 19 March 2018, Ciné-ONU will be screening ‘Which Children Matter?’ in order to mark the [International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination](#) . In this film, you will meet Czech and Slovak Romani immigrant children, several considered ineducable by their own societies, as they thrive in a new school, in a new language, in an equitable environment in the UK. Tune in live to hear Jenne Magno discuss the discrimination against Romani children in education and how, in November 2007, the European Court of Human Rights found the Czech Republic had unlawfully, indirectly discriminated against such children in violation of the European Convention on Human Rights and what has been done since.

The screening will be followed by a conversation on the issues highlighted in the film. The guest speakers will include: Jenne Magno (Director); Andor Urmos (DG Regio, European Commission); Claude Cahn (UN Human Rights Regional Office for Europe); moderated by Deborah Seward (UNRIC).
